## Coordinated Entry System for Survivors (SCES)

The Coordinated Entry System for Survivors (SCES) is designed to provide streamlined access to housing and supportive services for survivors of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking who are experiencing homelessness or housing insecurity.

Friendship Shelter partners with the County of Orange and the Office of Care Coordination to administer SCES.

## **SCES ELIGIBILITY**

To qualify for SCES, survivors must meet the Category 4 definition of homelessness as defined by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD):

- The survivor or family is fleeing or attempting to flee domestic violence.
- The survivor has no other residence.
- The survivor lacks the resources or support networks to obtain other permanent housing.
